Bipartisan Workgroup Seeks Your Input

Unemployment is at the highest level since the Great Depression and as reported in the press, thousands of individuals gathered in Lansing to protest the April 9, 2020, executive orders that increased restrictions and extended the stay-at-home mandate to midnight, April 30, 2020.

From there, you are asked to submit your proposals and suggestions for "safety protocols" that should be implemented, as well as suggestions for other sectors as well. Suggestions regarding "social distancing" measures as to employees and interactions with the public are likewise invited.
