USCIS Announces Implementation of 2021 H-1B Registration Process

On 01/09/2020, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services ("USCIS") formally announced the implementation of the H-1B registration process for fiscal year 2021 H-1B cap-subject petitions. Employers seeking to file FY2021 H-1B cap-subject petitions, including those eligible for the advanced degree exemption, must first electronically register and pay a \$10 fee for each registration they submit to USCIS.

Under this new process, employers seeking H-1B workers subject to the cap, or their authorized representatives, must complete a registration process that will require basic information about the company and each requested worker. Employers and their representatives will be required to setup accounts prior to March 1, 2020. The registration period will be open from March 1, 2020 to March 20, 2020. USCIS will then run a random selection process. Per USCIS on March 31, 2020, selected registrants will be notified of their eligibility to continue the H-1B cap-subject filling process. Registrants will have 90 days to file their H-1B capsubject petitions beginning April 1, 2020. A cap-subject H-1B petition will be considered properly filed if it is based on a valid, selected registration for the same beneficiary. Petitioners can register multiple aliens during a single online submission.
