# Butzel attorney Beth Gotthelf featured during MAEP panel program on June 29

TROY, Mich. – **Butzel** attorney **Beth S. Gotthelf** will be featured during a panel program presented by the Michigan Association of Environmental Professionals (MAEP) on Wednesday, June 29, 2022 in Howell.

The road map for environmental consultants conducting Phase I ESAs on commercial real estate, known as the ASTM standards, is being revised. Participants will learn about the proposed standard's, ASTM Standard E1527, speed limits, potholes, and alternate routes. The discussion will include the lender's perspective and legal implications, including the dilemma of having an existing standard plus a proposed standard.

Gotthelf is Butzel's Director of Innovation and External Relations, Co-Chair of the Energy & Sustainability Practice, and Co-Chair of the Aerospace & Defense industry team.
