Representative Matters

Michael has tried over 60 jury trials to verdict, including:

- Obtained a defense verdict for a Lake County hospital and its named nursing personnel in the death of a twin at birth. The plaintiff asked the jury for \$7 million. The trial lasted three weeks.
- Obtained a defense verdict for an orthopedic surgeon accused of making improper sexual advances to a female patient.
- Obtained a defense verdict on behalf of an internist who was alleged to have failed to diagnose a myocardial infarction when treating a patient in his office, leading to his death two days later. The trial of that case lasted one and a half weeks.
- Obtained a defense verdict on behalf of a pain management physician after his patient had fallen from a procedure table in the process of an epidural. The co-defendant hospital was held liable on a \$750,000 award.
- Obtained a defense verdict for an orthopedic practice involving severance of the median nerve during carpal tunnel surgery.
