Jane Schlicht Quoted in Article on Precedent-Setting Rejection of DTSA Suit

Jane C. Schlicht, a Milwaukee-based Intellectual Property Practice partner at Hinshaw & Culbertson LLP, was quoted in the article "First Defend Trade Secrets Act Case Rejected," published by *Intellectual Property Magazine* on August 15, 2016.

The article focuses on the U.S District Court for the Southern District of Florida's decision in *M.C. Dean V. City of Miami Beach*, No. 16-21731. In that case, the court dismissed one of the first lawsuits brought under the Defend Trade Secrets Act (DTSA), a federal law designed to protect trade secrets. The court found that plaintiff failed to show it took reasonable steps to protect the privacy of payroll information that it claimed a union wrongly obtained from the City of Miami Beach. Said Ms. Schlicht in the article, "The [...] dismissal [...] highlights how critical it is for businesses to identify and inventory their trade secrets and implement the necessary precautions to protect their secrecy[.] Failure to do so can have devastating results[.]" She added, "[Plaintiff] failed to establish it took reasonable steps to protect the secrecy of the claimed trade secrets, in particular noting the complaint did not allege the agreement by which [plaintiff] disclosed certain information claimed to be a trade secret imposed an obligation to protect the secrecy of the information."
