#### **Lateral Movement – Another Take on the Unfinished Business Rule**

*Geron v. Robinson & Cole LLP, et al.*, 2012 WL 3800766 (S.D.N.Y., Sept. 4, 2012)

Risk Management Issue: What are the special financial risks potentially faced by firms seeking to hire lawyers laterally from firms that dissolve? What is the meaning and scope of the “unfinished business” rule? What can hiring firms do to manage the risks of the application of the rule in connection with lawyers whom they hire – and what can firms generally do to prevent the issue from arising? What are the implications of opposite decisions from the same court on the future of the unfinished business rule – and how should firms deal with the risks while the uncertainty continues?
