

Robert Gerber has worked on a number of major cases for Taylor Made Golf Co., including trade secret cases, patent and invention cases and false advertising cases. Gerber also won a ground-breaking Ninth Circuit decision in a pro bono case, Hernandez-Montiel v. INS, 225 F.3d 1084 (9th Cir. 2000). The case established that persecution on the basis of "sexual identity" was sufficient to establish grounds for prohibiting deportation in immigration asylum cases. The case was cited in the recent gay marriage cases decided by the California Supreme Court.
