Starting **July 1**, California employers across all industries must have a written Workplace Violence Prevention Plan ("WVPP") in place. The recently enacted **SB 553** established this new requirement, along with mandatory employee training, initial and periodic workplace violence hazard inspections, and maintenance of a violent incident log and other related records.
