Fong served as cochair of the California "Bush for President" campaign and also served on the National Executive Board of the Bush "Victory 2000" Finance Committee. Following President Bush's election in November 2000, Fong served on the Presidential Transition team, providing advice and drafting issue papers on the international policy goals for the incoming Secretary of the Treasury.

Fong is a graduate of the United States Air Force Academy and earned his M.B.A. from Pepperdine University. He received his J.D. from Southwestern University. Fong is a Lieutenant Colonel in the Air Force Reserves and has served in the Reserves since 1980. As a Reserve officer, he has been the Chief for Budget and Congressional Analysis for the Pentagon since last year. Fong serves on the Board of Regents for both Pepperdine University and for Los Angeles Children's Hospital. He is also on the Board of Directors of the Los Angeles Boy Scouts, ESS Technology, and Trust Company of the West (Galileo Fund), among others. In addition, Fong is Chair of the Leadership America Foundation. Fong's mother, March Fong Eu, served as California Secretary of State from 1975-1994.
