"Whatever the workplace situation, the first step toward complying with regulations and having successful inspections is for employers to understand their underlying obligations."

Throughout the article, Barrientos and Rose offer tips on preparing for and responding to OSHA inspections and enforcement, emphasizing the value of employing "experienced safety counsel and safety teams" when addressing the potential impacts of the agency's impromptu actions and providing specific steps to prepare for OSHA's inevitable knock at one's door.
