The attorneys examine the regulatory landscape concerning per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), including existing environmental safeguards and ongoing efforts to regulate PFAS at both state and federal levels, and offer insight on when companies should expect to be asked to sample for PFAS. They also detail the pros and cons of proactively testing for PFAS and provide guidance on the factors companies should consider before conducting PFAS testing.

"A proactive approach presents risks, including technological challenges associated with testing and, the potential that such information will need to be disclosed," the attorneys write. "But it also presents a number of benefits, allowing the company to realistically assess exposure, collect documentation, control the scope and cost of sampling and remediation, and evaluate insurance coverage."

The attorneys say the decision to proactively investigate and sample for PFAS is multifaceted and will ultimately depend on the facts and circumstances of the particular case, however, "weighing the risks and benefits will allow in-house counsel to help chart a path forward."
