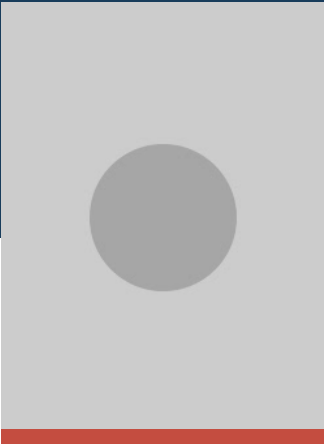




Michael T. Fahy
