Shortly after graduation, Katrisha began coaching moot court teams at her alma mater. Even while working full time at the Court of Appeals, Katrisha would spend 15-20 hours a week to help prepare a team of four students for competition. As an adjunct professor of appellate advocacy at Houston College of Law, Katrisha plans to continue to mentor Houston’s future lawyers. It’s just part of her way of giving back to the legal community that has given her great opportunities.”
