The following are a few recent updates identified in the past month. However, as always, a complete list of countries may be found in our Google Document.

## **Update Highlights**

- The Federal Circuit has further extended access restrictions to the National Courts Building complex October 31, 2021.
- The U.S. Patent and Trademark Office modified the COVID-19
   Prioritized Examination Pilot Program to accept applications until
   December 31, 2021. Requests that are compliant with the pilot
   program's requirements and are filed on or before December 31,
   2021, will be accepted, even if more than 500 requests have already
   been approved.
- The EPO has released updated guidance for oral proceedings before the Boards of Appeal.
- The Australian IP Office has reaffirmed its commitment to providing extensions of time to applicants affected by COVID-19. Requests for such extension can be requested through their <u>online portal</u>, through phone at 1300 651 010, and international through +61 2 6283 2999.
- The Indian IP Office has released details of fees refunded against withdrawal of Patent Applications (Form 29) during January, 2021 to March, 2021.
- Other general closures & deadline extensions have been added to the document.
